Apologies if this letter is incorrectly addressed. I very much appreciate your opening today's Heritage Committee meeting to remote participation--and am very sorry that I will not be able to attend.

I write in regard to the application for a demolition permit for the yellow brick house in Morriston built by David Morlock about 1909.

I would ask you to reject any such demolition permit with an eye to preserving the house and its historic value. Others can speak more specifically to the building's specific architectural merit. Prompted by the much appreciated work of the extraordinary Puslinch Historical Society, I would ask you to consider the residence's contribution to Puslinch Township's heritage and the distinctive built environment of Morriston. As other houses of the same period continue to disappear to neglect and development, I really hope that you can see the value of preserving this fine example—and establish a pattern for productively living with, rather than just razing, Puslinch's past.
