Whereas the Province of Ontario has proposed amendments to the Planning Act through Schedule 7 of Bill 119, the Protecting Ontario's Streets and Communities Act, 2026, to authorize municipalities to utilize Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs) for zoning by-law contraventions related to prohibited land uses; and

And Whereas the current enforcement process for zoning by-law violations requires prosecution through the Provincial Offences Court system, which can be time-consuming, costly, resource-intensive, and result in lengthy delays before compliance is achieved; and

And Whereas rural municipalities often face unique challenges in enforcing zoning by-laws due to limited staffing resources, large geographic areas, and increasing complexity of land use issues; and

And Whereas the proposed AMP framework would provide municipalities with a more efficient and responsive compliance tool while maintaining procedural fairness through administrative review and appeal mechanisms; and

And Whereas the proposed changes would reduce pressure on the Provincial Offences Court system by resolving appropriate zoning enforcement matters through an administrative process rather than requiring formal court proceedings; and

And Whereas a streamlined administrative process would provide greater certainty and timelier outcomes for both municipalities and property owners, encouraging voluntary compliance and reducing enforcement costs; and

Now Therefore Be It Resolved That the Council of the Township of Puslinch supports the Province's proposed amendments to the Planning Act under Schedule 7 of Bill 119 permitting the use of Administrative Monetary Penalties for zoning by-law contraventions relating to prohibited land uses; and,

That Council recognizes these amendments as providing municipalities, particularly rural municipalities, with a practical, efficient, and cost-effective enforcement tool that will improve compliance outcomes while reducing administrative and legal burdens; and,

That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Premier, Honourable Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), the Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA), MPP Joseph Racinsky, and all Ontario municipalities for consideration and support.

16. NOTICE OF MOTION:

16.1 Councillor Goyda submits the following notice of motion to be considered by Council at the July 15, 2026 Council Meeting:

WHEREAS the intersection of Watson Road South and Arkell Road serves as a key gateway and central gathering area within the Village of Arkell and accommodates significant vehicular, pedestrian, and cycling traffic

AND WHEREAS residents have raised ongoing concerns regarding vehicle speeds, compliance with traffic control devices, traffic queues, and overall safety at this intersection

AND WHEREAS residents have reported collisions, near misses, and vehicles failing to stop at the intersection, creating safety concerns for motorists, pedestrians, cyclists, and other road users

AND WHEREAS traffic volumes during peak periods, particularly during school and commuter hours, can result in significant vehicle queues and delays on all approaches to the intersection

AND WHEREAS sidewalks exist on portions of the intersection, however, there are no marked pedestrian crossings or other traffic control measures that clearly define crossing locations or reinforce right-of-way expectations for pedestrians and motorists

AND WHEREAS the intersection experiences regular pedestrian activity, including children and families accessing nearby businesses and community destinations located adjacent to the intersection

AND WHEREAS recent vandalism of traffic calming measures within the Village highlights the challenges associated with managing vehicle speeds and promoting road safety through existing measures alone

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Township of Puslinch request that the County of Wellington undertake a review of the intersection of Watson Road South and Arkell Road to assess existing traffic operations, pedestrian activity, cyclist usage, collision history, traffic control compliance, and overall safety conditions, and identify potential measures to improve safety and intersection operations;

AND FURTHER THAT the review consider the intersection's function as a village centre, the presence of nearby businesses and community destinations, peak-period traffic congestion, and the need to provide safe and clearly defined crossing opportunities for pedestrians and cyclists including consideration of whether enhanced pedestrian crossing measures may be warranted, and the potential for traffic diversion onto adjacent local roads, including Boreham Drive, and any associated impacts on neighbourhood safety.

AND FURTHER THAT the County report back to the Township regarding the findings of the review and any recommendations to improve safety for motorists, pedestrians, cyclists, and other road users at this intersection.
